CHILDREN MINISTRY

"Turning the hearts of the fathers to their children." Malachi 4:6

God ordained the father to be the spiritual head of the family, for too long that role has been left vacant and children have been affected. Children Ministry in Subang

One fifth of the church is made up of children, aged 0 to 13. Classes cater for the various age groups. We use the Lifeway materials for teaching. Annual events include Discovery Days and Memory Verse Competition. Discovery Days is an outreach event to reach children who are unsaved. The Memory Verse Competition is a channel to encourage children to memorize scripture verses. Occasionally, the older children have outdoor projects like visiting orphanages. The majority of the teachers are ladies and they are very committed.

Prayer points:

1. Protection for the children
 - a. as they face pressures of life like exams, parental expectations.
 - b. from the evils that are around us e tc kidnapping, bullying, fighting
 - c. from temptation of over playing cyber games.
2. For parents that they will be wise in bringing up their children.
3. Up coming events : Children Prayer Rally, Discovery Days
4. New leaders will arise in this ministry.
5. The spouses of the teachers who are not saved.

SS 2 Chinese Children Ministry.

The SS2 Chinese Sunday School has around 20 children with 4 teachers during the first service. Some of these children whose parents stay back for the second service will join the English Sunday School.

Puchong Children Ministry

Pray for all the ladies involved in this ministry, that they will inculcate Christian principles and values, teaching the Word faithfully, and raising the children in the fear of the Lord.

Church and Local Missions

The fulfillment of the Great Commission demands the spreading of God's love to where it has not been before. The good news of Jesus must move to new places and to new people groups. The book of Acts demonstrates exactly just that by the power of the Holy Spirit. Firstly, He even allowed persecution to push His people outwards from Jerusalem and Judea to new places. Then He persuaded the Jewish believers that His message of love was not only meant for the Jews but also for the Gentiles. He also set apart a few of His best workers (Barnabas and Paul) to bring the good news to new people and new places in the Roman Empire.



In Malaysia, churches are mainly located in richer urban areas of some states. The love of God has therefore only touched the urban Chinese, Indian and a few indigenous communities. To address this uneven distribution, local missions play a key role. Besides sharing the good news of Jesus, missions need to lift up the socio-economic standings of the poor, rural and under-privileged people of the land. No single

church or denomination can accomplish this task alone. The Body of Christ in Malaysia needs to work together.

Pray:

- Stronger local missions to be carried out by believers in places "not where Christ was already named." (Romans 15:20).
- Increased number of churches and fellowships in northern and eastern states of Peninsular Malaysia.
- Unity and co-operation among churches to launch local missions through consultations and mutual support.

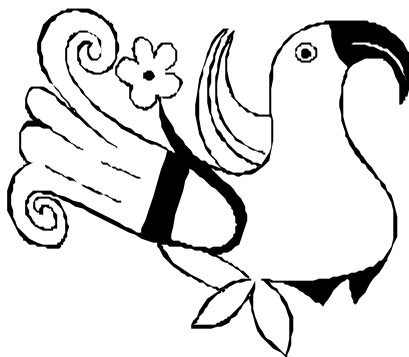
Sarawak, Bumi Kenyalang, "The Land of the Hornbills"

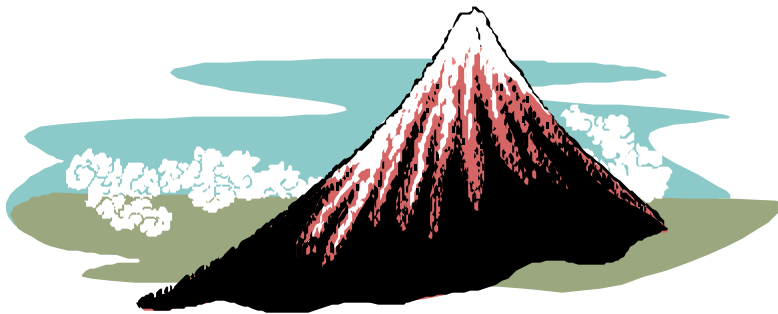
Sabah, Negeri Di Bawah Bayu

“The Land Below the Wind”

Capital : Kota Kinabalu (the old name was Jesselton)
Governor : Tun Datuk Seri Panglima Haji Ahmadshah Abdullah
Chief Minister : Datuk Musa Haji Aman
Population : About 2.9 million people

Sabah is home to Malaysia’s highest mountain, Mount Kinabalu. Despite its rich natural resources, it is the poorest state with the most number of poor people.

Sabah’s local chiefs had historic links with the Brunei Sultanate as well as the Sulu Sultana te in southern Philippines. The state was taken over by the British North Borneo Company in 1881. Early in World War II, Jesselton (renamed Kota Kinabalu in 1968) was razed by the retreating British to prevent it from falling into the hands of the Japanese.



Pray:

- God’s Spirit to move like a wind to sweep over Sabah to bring about change.
- Good leaders in Sabah who will look after the needs of the people.
- Money to be used to help make life better for those who are poor.
- Safety of the people living in Sabah especially those staying near the Sulu Sea where there are pirates.
- The police to be able to arrest those involved in buying and selling drugs,
- The Church in Sabah to be united and to reach out to the youth, children and to help the poor.
- Christians to guard against nominalism and complacency.

TOUCH COMMUNITY SERVICES

Touch Dialysis Centre in Kota Damansara

The proposed dialysis centre is located on two (2) ground floors at No 26 & 28, Jalan PJU 5/16, Dataran Sunway, Kota Damansara, 47810 Petaling Jaya, Selangor. Its specific objective is to establish a dialysis centre to provide the much needed service for end-stage renal failure patients. This initiative is a response to the call by our Malaysian government to set up more dialysis centres to cater for the increasing number of kidney failure patients. In 2004, the Ministry of Health registered 2,538 new cases of dialysis patients as compared to 1,542 new cases in 1999. The World Health Organization (WHO) expects the number of Asians suffering from kidney failure to increase TWO-FOLD in the next 30 to 40 years.

Providing dialysis service to end-stage renal failure patients is a long-term on-going process, as each patient has to dialyze 3 times a week to keep alive. The cost incurred, if the dialysis treatment is received at a private hospital, could ranges from RM 3,000 to RM 4,000 per month. At this moment, the government hospitals are simply unable to cope with the increasing number of patients. Hence, there is a great and urgent need to provide uncompromising quality dialysis treatment for patients coming from the lower income group of our society.

Pray:

- Be a Patient Sponsor by donating a sum of RM 5,000 to cover part of the subsidy of one patient.
- Be a Capital Cost Sponsor by donating a sum of RM 42,000 to cover the cost to purchase one unit of dialysis machine.
- Donate any amount to our Trust Fund that will generate revenue for PERSATUAN DIALYSIS TOUCH to continue subsidizing the patients who are truly in need.

Being a non-profit charity organization, we depend on the generosity and goodwill of supporters to continue with our work to the needy.

We are in the process of advertising for two State-registered nurses (SRN) and nursing aids. Besides, interested church members can serve in the various sub-committees of the Management Team. Church members can also serve in the dialysis center by volunteering as counselors and care-givers. Training will be provided.

Population : About 1.5 million people

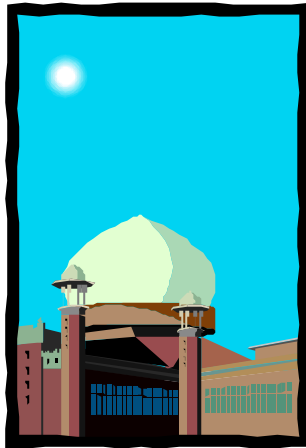
Kelantan is known as a center for Islamic learning, a place where many people go to learn about Islam. Kota Bharu, the state capital, was declared an "Islamic City" on October 1, 2005. Malaysia's oldest mosque is found in Kelantan.

Pantai Sabak in Kelantan was the entry point for Japanese invasion to Malaya. Kelantan's history also sees the wars between local rulers and rebellion against British rule. Two years after independence from Britain, Parti Islam SeMalaysia ((PAS) began to rule Kelantan. From 1978 to 1990, Barisan Nasional ruled Kelantan. However, in subsequent elections, PAS managed to regain control as the ruling party.

This conservative state is known for her enterprising women. It is the only state ever ruled by a female ruler, Cik Siti Wan Kembang.

Pray:

- God will show His grace and beauty to the people of Kelantan.
- Honest and wise leaders to care for the people, especially the poor.
- Those who do not know Jesus – that they will come to know Jesus loves them.
- Families that are broken because of divorce. Pray that God will heal the hearts of the fathers, mothers and children in these families.

OVERSEAS MISSION - CHINA

Ephesians 4:7, 11-16 "But to each one of us grace was given according to the measure of Christ's gift.....And He himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ."

Five-fold Ministry in China

The Vision is to win China back for Christ Jesus; uniting China's churches and raising up a new generation of disciples in China with a passion to join churches overseas so that the Great Commission of winning the world for Jesus is accomplished.

The 2005 -2008 visionary goals are:

1. Leadership training for 1000 church leaders in 8 provinces.
2. Proper training for 40 bible school students in 3 centres in GuangDong province, and plant 100 churches by 2008.
3. Production and supply of training materials- bibles with commentaries, books, VCDs, MP3 CDs/ DVDs/CD ROMs.
4. Producing MP3 Audio bibles in different Chinese dialects.
5. Co-work with English Language school in GZ city as avenue for ministry of youth leaders/workers in the city.

The Mission involves discipleship, educating, equipping and training to build a strong body of Christ for prepared for gifting endowed by the grace of Christ for some to be apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers.

The discipleship, teaching, equipping, training and mentoring Ministry is provided in 8 bible schools in HuBei, Shandong, LiaoNing, HeiLongJiang, GuiZhou, YunNan, GuangXi, DongGuan. The teachers are drawn together by the Lord from different churches including more than 12 overseas pastors/bible school teachers. The normal bible school training program spans a teaching period of 6-12 months which is interspersed bi-monthly by 1-month practicum in the mission field. The number of students in each bible school ranges between 20 to 45 with 2 full time teachers and 10 traveling teachers.

Pray:

- Praise the Lord that all the 8 Bibles Schools mentioned above are self-supporting by surrounding house churches. Pray that God continues to richly supply all their needs
- Pray for another bible school to be set up in ZhongSanCity which was jointly founded by a Taiwan pastor and Bro David Chee.
- Praise the Lord for providing 8 overseas Pastors and some China pastors for topical teaching and more than 500 DVDs/VCDs as training tools. Pray for the Lord's protection and anointing of these pastors/teachers and continual supply of teaching materials.
- For the Holy Spirit's special anointing of CBC's Bro David Chee with wisdom, coordinating leadership and protection for him, his wife and 2 daughters

Terengganu Darul Iman

“Abode of Faith”

- Capital : Kuala Terengganu (Royal Capital)
- Sultan : Sultan Mizari Abidin
- Menteri Besar : Dato’ Seri Idris Jusoh
- Population : About 1.5 million people

The worship of Guan Yin (the Chinese Goddess of Mercy) in Malaysia was first introduced in Terengganu. This state may be the earliest place where the Chinese from China landed on our country. Nonetheless, Terengganu is popularly claimed as the first Malay state to receive Islam. The *Batu Bersurat Terengganu*, Terengganu Stone, dated 1303, is the earliest Islamic relic found in Malaysia.

Islam grips the hearts and minds of those who take pride in Terengganu Islamic legacy. The religious leaders (*‘ulama’*, *‘iman’*) and teachers (*‘ustaz’*, *‘ustazah’*) remain influential. The BN state government administration continues to reflect Islamic identity.

Pray:

- God’s blessings upon the strongly religious people living in Terengganu.
- Good leaders to take care of the people especially the poor.
- The people will not worship other gods but come to know Jesus Christ and follow Him.
- Economic sufficiency, just distribution of wealth, effective eradication of poverty. More jobs for the people and for the fishermen to be able to earn more money. (90% of the fishermen earn less than RM500 per month.)
- God will set many people free from drug addiction. (HIV rates especially among the fishermen are quite high.)
- Churches in Terengganu to be strong so that they can help the people who need God in their lives.

LOCAL MISSIONS

Matt 25:35-40 *“For I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in; I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick, and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me. Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, ‘Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?’ And the King will answer and say to them, ‘Assuredly I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.’ ”*

Myanmar Migrant Ministry - Solace to the Sojourner

In recent years, large numbers of Myanmar migrants have been flocking to Malaysia to seek asylum as refugees or to work as economic migrants. Among the asylum seekers, the Myanmar Chin from Chin State forms the largest group (12,000 and increasing). The Chins are largely Christians or at least they profess to be. Those that are here are the 3rd generation Christians with their grandparents being converts by the early missionaries in their home State.

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees’ office in Malaysia (UNHCR) who register and assist refugees have temporary closed registration for new Chin arrivals, leaving many of them without refugee documents. There are refugees who have been detained as illegals. They also have difficulties in securing jobs and renting places to stay because of their status. At times, they are victimized by some ruthless employers who short pay or do not pay them for work done. They are also the easy targets of thugs who mark and rob them. When stopped by the police, many prefer to bribe them rather than risking being jailed.

Pray:

- For God’s protection and provision for the needs of the refugees
- The cultural Christians will experience being BORN AGAIN.
- Myanmar churches/fellowship groups in Malaysia will experience a new level of faith and intimacy in their worship
- Malaysian churches will serve both physical and spiritual bread to the Myanmar migrant in our land
- The various ethnic Myanmar groups will be united, and work together to win their fellow Myanmaris for Christ.

Action: (Contact bro. Loke Chee Kwong 017-6030668)

- Visit a refugee family
- Visit to encourage refugees in detention or prison
- Volunteer to help in a teaching session for refugee children
- Worship with Myanmar migrant in their church or home fellowship

‘Abode of Tranquility’

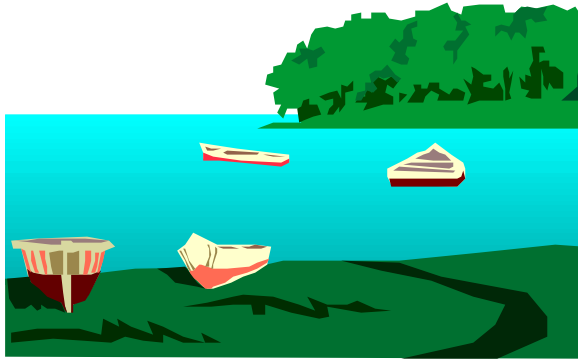
Capital : Kuantan (Royal Capital – Pekan)

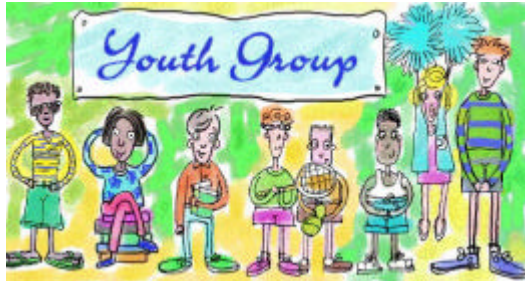

Johor Darul Takzim

“Abode of Dignity”

- Capital : Johor Bahru (Royal Capital – Pasir Pelangi)
- Sultan : Sultan Mahmood Iskandar Al-Haj
- Menteri Besar : Dato’ Haji Abdul Ghani Othman
- Population : 3.1 million people

The Johor-Riau Empire was the only empire to emerge in the Malay Peninsula after the fall of Melaka. Johor gave birth to Malay nationalism which led to the forming of United Malay National Association (UMNO) on May 11, 1946. It was the first state and currently the only state in Malaysia that has its own military force called Johor Military Force or ‘Timbalan Setia Negeri’, a private army of the Sultan of Johor.

The name ‘Johor’ originated from the Arabic word *Jauhar*, which literally means “Precious Stones.” Johor is joined to Singapore by the Causway.

Pray:

- The people to come to know Jesus Christ and to become God’s children.
- The police to keep the place peaceful and free from crime (e.g. robbery and snatch thieves) and immorality.
- Good friendship between Johor and Singapore. Pray that they will work together and help each other.
- The leaders will help the Orang Asli to find new places to live.
