Matthew 16:18 – “And I say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it.”

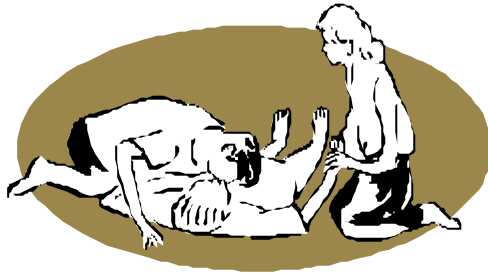
In the New Testament, the word “church” comes from the Greek word “ecclesia” which means an assembly or a group of believers meeting together. The church is not made up of bricks and cement but people who believe in Jesus.

Every time God’s children meet together to worship, pray and listen to God’s Word in a particular place, that group of people make up the local church.

God’s Spirit unites us though we are different. We may be of different race, have different levels of education, have different family backgrounds and so on. But we can all love one another and be united as one family because of Jesus. We are the local church.

Pray:

- God to help us to love one another so that our “local church” is strong and the people around us will want to know more about our God.
- God’s abundant blessings upon the church-based relief / social / community services (e.g. CBC’s various Touch Community Services programs.)
- God to show us how to love one another.
- Adequate resources (e.g. funds) and manpower (e.g. committed Christians) to respond quickly to crisis and the needs of the afflicted.
- Good network and greater co-operation with government social agencies or NGOs to address issues such as social ills, moral decadence, social and communal injustices, etc. (Remember to uphold sister Lina Joy in her fight for human rights.)

LOCAL MISSIONARIES

Nancy Quay - a Family Therapist who has been serving the Lord faithfully in Malaysia and overseas since 1978. Her ministries include counseling pastors, church leaders and their families. She is a member of the NECF prayer commission and is in charge of Puchong Pastors and Prayer Leaders fellowship. Presently she heads the Elijah House Prayer Counseling School in Malaysia. She is a deaconess and member of the Pastoral team at CBC Puchong.

Pray:

- Wisdom in prioritizing time and ministries. Able to rest and relax.
- Ministry house for Elijah House and spiritual direction as the lease of the present place will be expiring.
- Philippines – August 19-27, teaching at YWAM counseling school with Mei Lin.

Loke Chee Kwong - Member of CBC since early 1975. He left a banking career in 1998 to join CBC as an administrative staff. After 7 years, he resigned in 2005 to work among Myanmar Migrants in Malaysia.

Currently he networks with local Myanmar Churches and Christian Fellowship groups to complement their ministry among the Myanmar migrants and refugees. Together with the Myanmar brothers, he visits Myanmar refugees in detention camps and prisons. He coordinates CBC volunteer teachers who are teaching Myanmar migrant children in Taman Alam Jaya, Cheras. He is also involved with the Malaysia Migrant Ministry under “Outreach to Foreign Workers - Myanmar Trek.”

Pray:

- Praise the Lord for preserving him in a robbery attack on April 1, 2006, and for healing his leg, which was injured in that incident.
- Divine protection and wisdom as he travels and moves around in the Migrant Ministry and also among the refugees.
- Good communication and working relationship with the Myanmar Church groups, the local churches and the UNHCR.

Loretta Chin – Joined CBC in 1997 and was called to full-time in 2000 as a Youth Co-ordinator. She left in 2003 to join YWAM in New Zealand and Philippines. She has also visited Laos, Thailand and Myanmar on short mission trips. Currently, she is Prayer Co-ordinator for the Subang-Sunway Centre as well as the Missions representative for the CBC Mission Board. Loretta has a vision to raise and disciple young Asian youth to go out or to go back to their own countries as Christ’s ambassadors.

Pray for:

- Her trip to Japan in October – for smooth visa application and financial provision.
- God to speak to her for a clear direction. Also for the right contacts in Japan.

“Historical State”

- Capital : Bandar Melaka
- Governor : Tun Datiuk Seri Utama Muhamad Khalid Yaakob
- Chief Minister : Datuk Seri Mohd Ali Mohd Rustam
- Population : About 700,000 people

The first Malay Sutan was from Melaka but today the state has no sultan. The Portuguese were the first people to bring Christianity to Peninsular Malaysia. The first Jesuit missionary to arrive in Melaka was St. Francis Xavier. Melaka was conquered by the Portuguese in 1511, the Dutch in 1641 and the British in 1824.

Pray:

- The people may know that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. (Situating here is the region’s oldest Protestant church along with Malaysia’s oldest Buddhist temple, Hindu temple and Catholic church.)
- God to forgive any wrong that Christians have done in this place in the past.
- Wisdom for the leaders to take good care of the place.
- The people will come to Jesus when they are in trouble and need help.
- Against corruption in Government Departments.
- Against crime (e.g. snatch thieves) robbery, brawls in bars, murders, gambling, adultery, immoral behaviour, motor-racing in streets, suicide.
- Evangelical efforts to bear fruit, effective networking between the Christian students, local churches in all campus outreaches. The ability to proclaim relevant message amidst different beliefs.

 Negeri Sembilan Darul Khusus
 “The Special Abode”

Capital : Seremban
Yang Di-Pertuan Besar: Tuanku Ja'afar ibni Almarhum Tuanku Abdul Rahman
Chief Minister : Dato' Seri Utama Haji Mohamad Haji Hasan
Population : About 900,000 people

The name is believed to derive from the nine districts of *nagari* (now known as *luak*) where the Minangkabaus (originally from West Sumatra) settled during the 15th century.

In the 18th century attacks by the Bugis forced the Minangkabaus to seek protection from a prince from their homeland. The Minangkabau ruler sent his relative, Raja Melawar. After stabilizing the situation, Raja Melawar established himself as Sultan of Johor and confirmed his position by the granting of the title Yang di-Pertuan Besar Negeri Sembilan (He Who is Highest Lord of the Nine States) in 1773.

Negeri Sembilan has provisions on the procedure to convert out of Islam in its state Islamic enactment.

Pray:

- People will know that God has created them uniquely in His own image.
- Relevant authority will take necessary steps to rectify the water woes in Seremban.
- Effective rehabilitation programs and measures to combat drug abuse.
- Economic development and employment opportunities to prevent brain-drain.
- Open doors for campus-outreaches.
- Church unity, vision and passion for the lost, more dedicated leaders and committed full time workers.

TOUCH COMMUNITY SERVICES

Let us discern the mind of God in all the activities undertaken at all CBC Centres.

Senior Citizens Club

Under the leadership of Edward and Christina Tan in Puchong Centre, the senior citizens in Puchong that have been touched by this ministry number about 400. The monthly events are well participated. The senior citizens gather in Bumble Bee for a Karaoke session's each month which they enjoy tremendously. **Pray** for physical strength as well as opportunities for witnessing at the right time. A similar club is proposed for **SEA Park** and **Kota Damansara**. **Pray** for good attendance and avenues for serving these retired residents there, and opportunities to share the gospel.

Ladies Club in Puchong

This was formed as an outreach to the ladies in the community. The club organizes bimonthly events. **Pray** for the ladies in CBC who have offered their services in this ministry that they will continue to serve with enthusiasm and joy. **Pray** for more residents to join the club, thereby opening up opportunities for our members to shine for Jesus Christ. **Kota Damansara** will also be establishing a Ladies Fellowship. **Pray** for a core of dedicated ladies to start this.

Men's Fellowship

The vision of the Men's Fellowship Ministry in Puchong is to see every man in the church a strong and effective servant leader. The mission is to produce 30 faithful strong men for effective service in God's Kingdom by end of 2006. **Pray** for willingness by more men to play an active and leading role in the church; to participate in community projects and charity works, and that God will grant them unity, guidance and divine wisdom.

Badminton Fellowship

The CBC Subang-Sunway Centre has started this badminton fellowship a few months ago. They meet every Sunday evening in USJ 1. Both young and old join in the activity. **Pray** that this activity will foster friendship evangelism.

Football Club

Federal Territories

There are three places that are called "Federal Territories" and they are as follows:-

Kuala Lumpur (KL)

Mayor : Datuk Ruslin Bin Hasan
Population : 1.5 million people
Kuala Lumpur literally means 'muddy river mouth' and was founded in 1857 at the meeting place between the Klang and Gombak rivers. It became the nation's capital in 1957 and was made a Federal Territory in 1974.

Putrajaya

Administrative Chairman : Tan Sri Dato' Samsudin Osman
Population : About 45,000 people
Putrajaya was founded on October 19, 1995, and named after Malaysia's first Prime Minister, the late Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-Haj. It became a Federal Territory in 2001.

Labuan

President of Labuan Corporation : Datuk Suhaili Abdul Rahman
Population : About 83,000 people.
The island of Labuan came under the rule of the Sultan of Brunei during the 14th century. Labuan was made a Federal Territory in 1984.

Pray:

- The people will know that God is the one who blesses them with money and success.
- Good leaders who will be fair and do what is right in God's eyes.
- All those who are working in the government offices. Pray that they will work hard to serve the people and the country.
- More centers to be set up to help drug addicts to be set free from drug addiction.
- The police to protect and help the people.
- The people to show kindness to the foreign workers (people from other countries who are working here) and to treat them fairly.
- Christians to shine as lights where God has put them so that people may come to know Jesus Christ.

OVERSEAS MISSION – NEW YORK

Ron Choong - CBC's missionary in New York and founder of **Academy for Christian Thought (ACT)**, an educational research ministry to equip the church for effective apologetic witness in the marketplace of ideas, by renewing the mind and developing a comprehensive worldview.

ACT's Vision - to develop a comprehensive worldview for a responsible proclamation of the Gospel.

ACT's Mission – By equipping Christians for a life of learning by study, growth by discipleship, and obedience by evangelism.

ACT's Goals – 1. Provide a theological safe space (tss) to learn about the gospel and seek to renew the mind. 2. Enrich the Christian life by fruitful interaction with every cultural sphere of human inquiry. 3. Equip the Church for productive growth, effective witness and caring discipleship.

The Rev. Mr. Ron Chong, joined CBC as a teen in the 70s. He left for further studies in the United Kingdom in the 80s. Ron is an ordained minister and founder of ACT. He read English Law, international politics, the natural sciences, the humanities & Christian theology at institutions in Malaysia, Great Britain and the United States. An apologist and evangelist in New York City since 1990, he also serves an international summer teaching ministry. Ron holds a B.A., LL.B. Hons., M.Div., Th.M., and S.T.M. degrees from Open London & Yale Universities as well as Princeton Theological Seminary, where he is completing a Ph.D. in philosophy of science and theology. His research interests include the emergence of human intelligence, moral cognition and the doctrine of the imago Dei.

Ron is married to Lingmei, and they live in New York City where he meets with graduate and post-graduate students daily.

Pray for Ron and Lingmei:

- Good health and protection in a city that is always in danger of crime.
- His studies, that he will complete with excellence.
- Wisdom and knowledge as he faces people with hard questions. May the Lord grant him revelation that will confound the "wise"
- Finances for the ministry as well as for his family.
- Continual encouragement from the family of God, that he will be sustained by prayer in difficult times.
- For journey mercies as he travels around the world to speak and minister.

- May their light shine for the Lord Jesus so that many be brought into the Kingdom of God through their ministry. And God's favour be upon them.

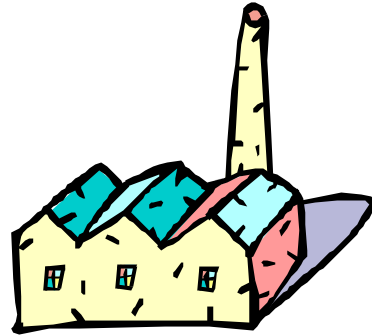

Selangor Darul Ehsan

“Abode of Sincerity”

Capital : Shah Alam (Royal Capital – Klang)
Sultan : Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah
Chief Minister : Dato’ Seri Dr Mohamed Khir Toyo
Population : 4.7 million

Much of Selangor’s history was written by the ancient Melaka and Johor sultanates that controlled the state. Bugis mercenaries (from Sulawesi) were instrumental in establishing the present royal family of Selangor.



Due to its rapid economic growth, Selangor is currently the most populous, richest, most industrialized and most urbanized of all the Malaysian states. Dato’ Seri Khir Toyo declared Selangor as a developed state on August 27, 2005.

Pray:

- People will receive the revelation of God’s unconditional love demonstrated by Jesus on the cross. They will realize the folly of putting their hopes in material wealth and on themselves.
- Foreign workers’ basic rights be respected, kindness and just treatment from their employers and agencies.
- Divine revelation and softening of hearts for thousands of college and university students, both local and foreign.
- Against all forms of crime, immorality and problems (e.g. drug addiction, gangsters, murders, robbery.)
- Wise management and good stewardship of the state’s water resources and environment.
- Wisdom, transparency, integrity and impartiality for Chief Minister and all local authorities in governance and implementing policies.
- Church: Unity effective role in issues affecting the community, excelling for God in the marketplace, passion in rural outreaches. Against complacency and humanistic values.

Pasar Malam (PM) Ministry

"Abode of Grace"

Capital : Ipoh (Royal Capital – Kuala Kangsar)
 Sultan : Sultan Azlan Shah Muhibbuddin Shah
 Menteri Besar : Dato' Seri DiRaja Mohamad Tajoi Rosli Ghazali
 Population : About 2.2 million people

Beruas, a small town in Perak, is believed to be the location of an ancient Hindu-Malay Kingdom called Gangga Negara (collapsed in early 11th century). It is also believed to be the birthplace of Islamic teaching.

The Pangkor Treaty in 1874 effectively gave the British a foothold in the Malay states while ensuring the power of the sultans over cultural and religious matters. Perak was once the richest state in the Peninsula due to tin ore mining in Kinta Valley. The country's largest Tibetan Buddhist temple is located here in Tambun.

Pray:

- People will know the reality of God's abundant grace and mercy.
- Authorities to have wisdom, integrity and respect for human rights in ensuring the proper running of Kamunting detention camp.
- Families to be strong and the young people will have love in their homes.
- Successful poverty eradication programs
- Wisdom for the police to fight crimes (e.g. drugs, robbery, murders.)
- Serious consideration for the welfare of the Orang Asli communities.
- God's guidance for the naval forces in preserving the security of the nation's territorial waters.
- The Church will share the good news about Jesus to the Chinese living in 134 Perak new villages.

YOUTH MINISTRY

Radical Youth –Jeremiah 1: 7-10

Youth today will determine the face of our society to come. What happens tomorrow is our responsibility today. Successful politicians, philosophers and world changers all know about the power of shaping hearts and minds of young and capitalize on it. But God knew it all along – shaping His world through changers like Samuel, David, Daniel, Jeremiah and Isaiah.

Pray:

- Visionary leaders and pastors who will model, teach and transform our young people's mindsets.
- Restoration of youth to their destiny, that they receive a prophetic vision of God's plans and destiny for this generation in Malaysia.

Action: Call up a young person today and express interest in his/her plans and future. Offer help and support all the way.

OTHER MINISTRIES

"Project Elijah" – Ministry to children who come from abusive homes.

Elijah Home was set up for mothers and their children who need a refuge for a short period (between a few months to a maximum of 2 years) due to domestic violence experienced. This home is not run by Christians. So, the CBC Team cannot share the gospel in a straight forward manner.

Brainchild of Pat Low, Youth from CBC Subang-Sunway Centre, "Project Elijah" consists of a team of volunteers made up mostly of young people. Every fortnight, the team will visit the home. The vision of PE is taken from Malachi 4:6 *"And He will turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers..."*



When our team visits, they would engage in the following activities:-

Play games, arts and crafts, telling stories, puppet shows and giving talks (e.g. on hygiene).

Prayer points:

- Restoration of family and the children.
- Children to know Christ whether through CBC team or through others.
- That the seeds planted by the CBC team will eventually grow and lead the children to know Jesus.
- For the PE vision – To bring Father God into their activities with Children.
- Pray that caretakers who run the home would eventually give their lives to the Lord.

- Pray that relationship with PE team and caretakers and children would continue to grow.
- That the Holy Spirit will continue to guide and help the PE team.

Pulau Pinang

“Pearl of the Orient”

Capital : Georgetown
 Governor : Tun Dato’ Seri Haji Abdul Rahman Haji Abbas
 Chief Minister : Tan Sri Dr Koh Tsu Koon
 Population : About 1.4 million people

The name “Pulau Pinang” translated literally from Malay means “betel nut island”. It is the only state in Malaysia where the Chinese are the majority.

Pulau Pinang was formerly a part of Kedah. The Sultan of Kedah gave it to British East India Company in 1786 in exchange for military protection. The arrival of Capt. Francis Light in 1786 also marked the beginning of British colonization in the Malay Peninsula. The island was then renamed the Price of Wales Island. It became a major trading port during the British era and was a free port until 1969.



Pray:

- The people will not bow to other gods but only to Jesus Christ.
- The leaders to have wisdom and know how to use the money to bless people.
- There will be no more gangsterism especially among the Chinese.
- Those in power will take strong actions to get rid of the drug problem. Penang has the highest number of drug addicts in Malaysia.
- The families that have been hit by the Tsunami. Pray that God will heal their pain and show His love to them through Christians.
- A greater unity and working together among the churches in Penang. Pray that the Christians will be on fire for Jesus Christ and go out to save the lost.

SHEPHERD GROUPS

CBC received the vision of a Cell Church in 1991, through Senior Pastor Richard Toh. The first pilot cell, or Shepherd Group, was launched in Subang with only 3 persons starting it. Soon, the cell multiplied. By the mid 1990s, the vision of the Cell Church was caught by the whole church. 15 years on, how have we faired? We need to ask God. What are the goals of our Church? The CBC Blueprint is a good reminder to all of us and here it is for us to pray and take action in areas we have neglected:

7 KEY / CORE VALUES

W - Word Foundation

We value the inspirational word of God as infallible and authoritative in our lives and this core value will be achieved through CBC’s statement of belief, our intention to learn how to study and interpret the bible, a regular examination of our doctrines and theology and these will be expressed through a strong pulpit expository preaching, a program to read through the bible in a year, and our equipping trek.

O - Outreach / Evangelism

We value evangelism as one of the core values of a Christian lifestyle and this is achieved through personal testimony, one to one evangelism, hospital visitation, community services, market place evangelism, funeral preaching and through our missions, whether at home, local or foreign and whether it is done through individuals, shepherd groups, congregational or church wide. We are committed to those who have been called by God to serve as missionaries.

R - Renewal / Life in the Spirit

We value life in the Spirit as one of the core values of our life in Christ and this is achieved through the expression of the gifts and enhancing the fruit of the Holy Spirit, true fellowship, dreams and visions, and a constant passion for renewal, revival and refreshment from the Lord.

S - Service that is enduring

We value enduring service as one of the values of serving God and this is achieved through consistency in our character, commitment to church, constant watch over heart issues, ownership of the vision, and helping to mentor the next generation of leaders through training, discipleship and counseling.

H - Holiness

We value holiness as one of the core values in our walk with God and this is achieved through a consistent character building that will be seen in our leadership example, a strong marriage and family life and a pure reverence of the fear of God.

I - Intimacy

We value intimacy as one of the core values of walking in Christ and this is achieved through sincere worship, sustained prayer, consistent devotion, disciplined meditation, quiet contemplation, periodic fasting and once-in-a-while-get-away solitude!

P - Purpose in Life

We value God's purpose in our life as one of the core values and this is achieved through spiritual formation of an understanding of the purposes of God, the kingdom of God, financial resources for end time purposes which includes giving and offering, the five fold governance of the church and the transformation of the locality through the people of God.

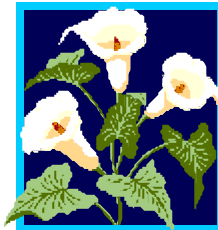

An Eternal House in Heaven
2 Corinthians 5: 1 – 10

The Apostle Paul was a tent maker and he compares our bodies to an "earthly tent." A tent is not as strong as a solid building.

He said that when our earthly body is destroyed (when we die), we will have a new body. He described our new body as "a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands."
